



Whether it's scanning through websites, chatting with friends, or reading e-books, many people use their smartphones or tablets at night before bed when they can't fall asleep or feel bored. Unfortunately, those people probably aren't getting a good night's sleep, as using electronic devices before going to bed can disturb sleep patterns, resulting in your body not getting the rest it needs.

Certain devices, such as tablets, smartphones, laptops, and several types of flat screen TVs, **give off** blue light. Blue light has been suspected of causing sleep problems for some time, and the latest research has just added to that belief. Scientists in Boston conducted some experiments and confirmed the consequences of using a tablet before bed. They discovered that, in comparison with reading a book, using a tablet at night makes people less sleepy. Thus, people spent less time in a deep sleep, and produced less **melatonin**, which helps regulate sleep. A lack of melatonin can also increase the risk of getting several cancers.

So if you are bored before bed, reading a book is still the best thing you can do. If that's not for you, try listening to some soft music. This will help you relax and sleep as well.
