III. Reading Comprehension: (20%)

T'ai chi ch'uan, originally a kind of Chinese martial arts, is becoming an increasingly popular exercise system all over the world. Derived from the concept of "Taiji" or "supreme ultimate" in Taoism, it is a combination of yin and yang which mean tranquility and movement respectively. The gentle movements, the underlying benefits for health, and the Asian essence of t'ai chi ch'uan attract all age groups.

Because some believe t'ai chi ch'uan can be a remedy for many medical conditions, including arthritis (關節炎), heart diseases, and muscle problems, many adults in both Asian and Western nations practice it. Busy employees also appreciate its stress-reducing effects. Unlike many other fitness systems, t'ai chi ch'uan uses no equipment and can be done either in large groups or solo, so it is an inexpensive and convenient form of exercise.

For these reasons, t'ai chi ch'uan has become particularly attractive to the elderly. In the USA and Canada, older adults are joining t'ai chi ch'uan groups, where they sometimes find themselves exercising next to 20yearolds. Slow movements of t'ai chi ch'uan are easy to do, so elderly people are not **intimidated**. "T'ai chi ch'uan is an exercise almost anyone who can walk can do safely," reports Judith Horstman for *Arthritis Today* magazine.

T'ai chi ch'uan has benefits for young people too. Some summer camps use it as a therapy for children suffering from juvenile arthritis. Besides, the emphasis on inner peace appeals to teenagers, making the pursuit of satisfaction from life seem interesting to them. To sum up, t'ai chi ch'uan promotes balance between practitioners' body and soul, and its gentle movements even burn more calories than intense exercise. In other words, t'ai chi ch'uan is a therapy not only for better physical condition but also for mental wellness.
