V. Reading Comprehension: (5%)

George Harrison (1943-2001) is famous for being a member of The Beatles. However, the people of Bangladesh, a country on the east side of India, have a very special memory of this musician. Harrison helped them in their hour of greatest need. He used his musical fame to bring global attention to Bangladesh's struggle to become independent from Pakistan.

The Bangladeshi people declared independence in 1971, because the Pakistani military government refused to give them any political power. As a result, Pakistan sent in its army, which killed three million Bangladeshis. Millions more poured across the border into India, to escape the killing. Very few people in America or Europe knew or cared about the horrific situation in this distant land. However, this all changed when George Harrison's Indian musician friend, Ravi Shankar, asked him to help arrange a small concert to raise money for the homeless Bangladeshi children. Appalled to find out about the mass killings, Harrison said to his friend, "That's nothing. Let's do something big." So he invited some world-famous rock musicians to perform in a special concert in New York.

The result was the 1971 Bangladesh concert. Shankar and Harrison played with stars such as Bob Dylan, Eric Clapton and Ringo Starr. Harrison himself wrote a beautiful song, "Bangladesh," which sold millions of copies. The concert made the world aware of the tragedy and aroused tremendous popular support for the Bangladeshi people. After neighboring India had **restored** order by sending its army to defeat the Pakistani forces, Bangladesh quickly gained independence. Nobody would back the Pakistani government, because people knew about its army's mass murders.

Today, the world has again forgotten this long ago war. In Dhaka, Bangladesh, the War Museum displays many images of the events of 1971. The copy of Harrison's "Bangladesh" is also exhibited there. In Bangladesh, Harrison will always be honored as a special friend, the musician who "did something big," to awaken international support for this suffering people's efforts to form their own country.
